Question: Are you thinking about hiring up to six partners separately or would it be beneficial for us to form a team of sorts?

Response: We are looking for creative ways of partnering and working together. If it makes sense to form a team that would bring economies of scale or additional strengths to the table, we are open to that approach. Other community organizations might be open to it as well because some of the insurance requirements and logistics of contracting might make sense for a larger organization agency to handle. We are deferring to community partners as to what would work best for them. We are very interested in working with place-based community groups that can conduct outreach through their existing community networks, so teaming with neighborhood and community based organizations might be a good approach.
