Whereas, the theme for AAPI Heritage Month 2022 is "Advancing Leaders Through Collaboration." Local and national governments are encouraged to prioritize collaboration, development, diversity, transparency, and inclusion through leadership training of persons of AAPI descent; and

Alameda's AAPI community, which comprises more than 32 percent of Alameda's population, includes business owners, educators, elected officials, lawyers, judges, artists, clergy members, and military personnel, as well as the heroic AAPIs who served on the front lines of the COVID-19 pandemic as health care professionals, first responders, teachers, and other essential workers; and

Whereas, AAPI Heritage Month 2022 commemorates the victims of the 2021 spa shootings, along with all other Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders who have been lost to anti-Asian violence during the pandemic and throughout history.
