- Share books, articles, and magazines. (Reading aloud might be welcome.)
- Encourage them to stay connected via video calls. (If they are reluctant, show them how easy it is.)

- Offer to clean or do other household chores.
- Bring over some flowers or an indoor plant.
- Watch a movie or TV show with them.

And let's not forget the hardworking caregivers of our seniors. If you know someone who could use a break, offer to step in for a few hours so that they can have some time off. Just be sure that with all these ideas, you practice social distancing, wear a mask, and frequently wash your hands.

As Americans, we have seen hard times before, and our older neighbors can teach us a few things about how to get through them. Let's learn from their resiliency, and let's keep helping each other. We will get through this together.

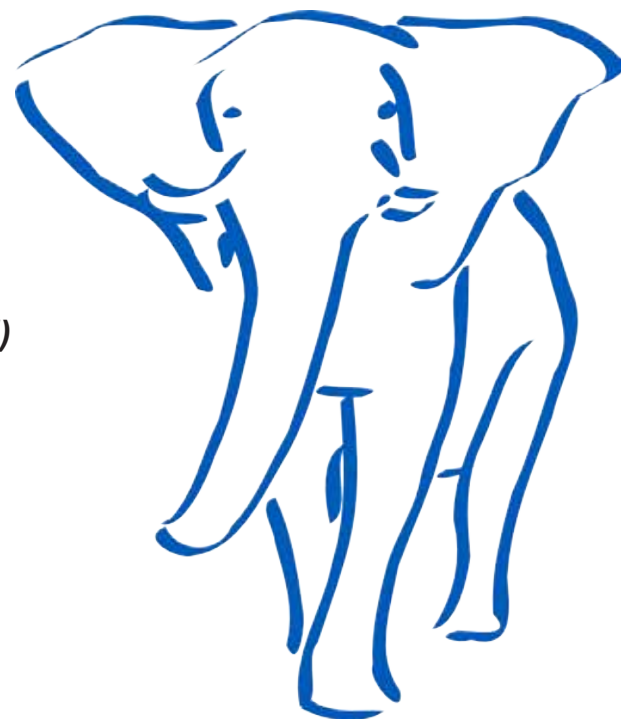

COVID FAQ: I Got the Vaccine. Is Life Normal Again? A Few Common Questions Answered.

People have a lot of questions about COVID-19 vaccines -- not just how to get them, their efficacy, and their safety -- but real-world questions, too, about what habits and pandemic practices will change in their daily life once they get vaccinated.

Many people remain confused about the answers to these and other real-world, practical questions. Doctors say there's a good reason for that confusion -- this is all very new, and the answers aren't always easy to come by.

"Nobody's done controlled clinical trials around these specific, real-life scenarios, so this is a confusing point for people," explains Greg Poland, MD, a vaccinologist and director of the Mayo Clinic's Vaccine Research Group. "We do not have precise data on this, so health experts are doing their best to answer these questions because people so desperately want answers. But in some ways, we have to acknowledge that we are speculating based on what we know about the vaccine and the biology and immunology of the virus."

The Real-World Effects of the COVID-19 Vaccine

Doctors say the good news is that 95% of people are protected from getting the virus and 100% are protected from severe disease 2 weeks after getting the second dose of the vaccine (either the Pfizer or Moderna version). But Poland points out that means 5% of people could still get sick from the virus because, for some reason, their body didn't mount a protective response to the vaccine.

While the risk is low, people can still also get COVID if they're vaccinated.

"We expect their symptoms would be milder but they could still transmit the virus. The new strain adds some unknowns into the

mix, too, and we're not yet entirely sure if people who are vaccinated can also still transmit the virus to others. So even once you're vaccinated, things can still remain complicated," explains Poland.

Lucy McBride, MD, a primary care doctor in Washington, DC, says all of that is scientifically true, but she thinks those risks are quite small and focusing on them, in her mind, puts too negative a spin on the vaccine and its promise for patients.

"We can and should allow ourselves the pleasure of looking forward to the days when we and our loved ones are vaccinated, because our risks of being together will be so very low and the benefit to our mental health high," she says. "The currently available vaccines are incredibly safe and effective, and being vaccinated is our ticket to a better future."

So what does actually change for you once you get the vaccine and wait the 2 weeks it takes for its full effect? Public health officials say they know people are looking for clarity on real-world situations. Here are some common questions to several doctors: McBride; Poland, who is also editor-in-chief of the journal *Vaccine*; David Cohn, MD, chief medical officer at the Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center in Columbus; and Anita Gupta, DO, a critical care doctor at Johns Hopkins University. Here are their responses, based on what is known about vaccines and the virus at this moment.

Does life return to normal once I'm vaccinated?

Not exactly.

"I know everyone wants to get the vaccine and go right back to normal, but it's unfortunately just not that simple," Poland says. "Vaccines plus masks allow us to start expanding our bubble among

other people who have gotten vaccines and wear masks. As enough of that happens and time goes by, we will have more and more data and precise estimates of when we are clear to return to normal, but we just don't know those things yet. It also gets even more complicated as new variants arise that may lead to a reduction in vaccine efficacy."

"Immunity is our path forward to be back towards normal," agrees Cohn. "Only when the vast majority of the population is vaccinated or immune to COVID will this occur."

"Vaccines are one part of the prevention strategy," Gupta adds. "Wearing masks, hand-washing, and social distancing are part of the comprehensive solution to this global pandemic impacting millions of lives."

McBride says she's stressing to her patients that vaccination speeds up the path to normal. "The current vaccines are highly effective. Widespread vaccination is our golden ticket to a better future."

Can I stop wearing a mask once I'm vaccinated?

No.

"Two weeks after your second Pfizer or Moderna vaccine dose, for example, you are essentially immune to COVID-19" McBride says. "But we haven't yet proven that vaccinated people can't carry and transmit the virus to other people. And until we have that information and have achieved herd immunity, whereby the virus can't infect most of the population, we need to adhere to the standard risk mitigation protocols: masking, hand-washing, distancing, and avoiding poorly ventilated, crowded indoor spaces."

New strains of the virus also add unknowns.

Once one person gets the vaccine and waits 2 weeks, can they hug family members who live outside their household who aren't yet vaccinated?

The answer to this question is unclear.

"We just don't know enough information on how transmissible individuals are and under what circumstances," Gupta says. "It's best always to keep your loved ones safe, and especially older adults who have higher risk."

"Since it's still not yet clear whether the vaccine prevents asymptomatic transmission, if you get the vaccine, you might be protected from any symptoms, but that doesn't mean you couldn't be infected without showing symptoms and transmit COVID to somebody who would then get sick from it," Poland explains. He does not recommend hugging when only one person involved has gotten the vaccine.

"Despite vaccination, the risk remains that COVID infection can occur and be transmitted even between two individuals who are vaccinated," Cohn echoes. "While the risk is lower without vaccination, an individual patient must weigh their tolerance for risk, given their increased chance of becoming infected with COVID."

McBride agrees. "The risk of getting sick with COVID when vaccinated people hang out together, even indoors, even unmasked, is almost zero. Nothing in life is risk-free, but it is extremely unlikely that vaccinated people can carry the virus and sicken one another. Could that change with variants over time? Absolutely," she says.

13 Documents You Need For Effective Planning

Several years ago, my dad was suddenly, and very unexpectedly, admitted to the hospital and given a grave prognosis. On the second day of his admission, I found myself the recipient of a handwritten, barely legible piece of paper that was to serve as his Will and Advance Directive. It also listed all of his passwords. I was bewildered.

Today, I am very grateful to be able to say that my dad is doing better than I ever could have imagined on that horrible day. And we have since dealt with the details of what I will need if he becomes incompetent or too ill to take care of his personal matters on his own.

We all need to be prepared for those horrible days - and the following documents will help you do just that. Once you've compiled and completed the documents, be sure to tell your family or designated others where

they're stored.

There are many options available for compiling and completing this information. Some people choose to hire professionals while others do it themselves or with the help of online companies. However you choose to proceed, start collecting these documents as soon as possible, and update them every few years to reflect changes in assets and preferences.

1. An Original Will

A will allows you to dictate who inherits your assets. Dying without a will means losing control of how your assets are distributed. Instead, state law will determine what happens. Wills are subject to probate – legal proceedings that take inventory, make appraisals of property settle outstanding debt and distribute remaining assets. One way to avoid probate is with a Revocable Living Trust.

2. A Revocable Living Trust

This is a transfer of ownership of various assets to a trust. You can serve as a trustee on behalf of the beneficiaries you designate. Or, you can appoint a trust executor in the event of your death.

3. Durable Financial Power of Attorney Form

This form designates who will make financial decisions on your behalf in the event that you are incapacitated.

4. Documentation of Assets

This includes housing and land ownership, cemetery plots, vehicles, stock certificates, savings bonds, any partnership or corporate operating agreements and a list of brokerage and escrow mortgage accounts.

5. Tax Returns (previous three years)

6. Banking Information

List of all bank accounts and online log-in information. List any safe deposit boxes, and register

your spouse or child's name with the bank and ask them to sign the registration so they can have access without securing a court order.

7. Durable Health Care Power of Attorney Form (Advance Directive)

This allows your designee to make health care decisions on your behalf if you are incapacitated.

8. Authorization to Release Protected Health Information Form

This allows you to designate people who can be given information about your health from your doctor or hospital.

9. A Physician's Order for Life-Sustaining Treatment (POLST) Form

This bright pink form is for terminally ill or people who are very old and frail and not expected to live more than a year. The POLST designates a preference for on the spot medical treatment in the emergency room, or by the EMTs.

10. Life Insurance Policies

Family members need to know the name of the carrier, the policy number, and the agent associated with the policy.

11. Benefits Accounts

This includes pensions, annuities, individual retirement accounts and (401)ks for your spouse or children. If your heirs don't know about these accounts, they won't be able to claim them.

12. Your marriage license, or your divorce judgment/ decree.

13. Your Birth Certificate and Social Security card.

WHAT HOME CARE AGENCIES ARE CHARGING FOR SERVICES IN ALAMEDA

In Alameda County, getting help at home isn't as easy as it sounds. For many, bringing a stranger into their home to take care of them in a very vulnerable time can seem overwhelming. There are worries about who that person might be, how much to pay them, how many hours they should work and the most prevalent: Can this person be trusted? While most would prefer a family member or someone they know take care of them, this may not always be the best thing. While promises are made, commitments can be difficult to keep. If caregiving is absolutely necessary, many find that hiring outside assistance with a regular schedule is the most reliable solution. That way, family members can remain as family, and others can be counted on to do the work.

There are many choices in hiring help at home. Many will hire privately, that is, pay out-of-pocket for help on an "as-needed" basis. There are many different ways to find caregivers. Some senior centers maintain lists, there are other sources from discharge planners, physician offices and hospice agencies. Remember, too, that if you hire privately, you work out the hours, rate of pay, etc... and, you're also an employer and must abide by IRS rulings for tax purposes. Here's a brief rundown on the types of agencies in Alameda County.

HOME HEALTH AGENCIES

These agencies provide services that are 100% covered by Medicare and Medi-Cal. The service must be ordered by a physician. However, clients still have a personal choice of any agency. There are certain

requirements for care, for one, you must be homebound and in need of skilled care. This would translate to a nurse or physical, occupational or speech therapy. This is also a time and visit limited service. Some aide service can be available, if there's a skilled need. This is a service NOT covered by long term care insurance. Born to Age does not list the prices these agencies charge because the costs are directly reimbursed by Medicare. Client is not billed for services.

PRIVATE DUTY HOME CARE AGENCIES

These agencies can provide both skilled and non-skilled medical care. The services might be covered by long term care, or other insurances, and private pay. The agency is the employer. Caregivers are hired, screened and paid for by the agency. If the caregiver is ill or unable to work, a substitute caregiver is available. The agency pays payroll taxes, worker's compensation and maintains liability coverage. The agency also determines what the caregiver can and can't do. There is over a minimum number of hours for service.

Care provided by these agencies can include: skilled care, personal care, transportation/errands, meal preparation, medication reminders, light housekeeping, laundry, etc. Shifts can be hourly, live-in or sleepover.

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The Surprising Health Benefits of Medicinal Mushrooms

The ancient Romans called them the “food of the gods.” Texts from Ancient India and fables from ancient Japan reveal their medicinal properties, and traditional Chinese medicine contains many recipes and treatments using them as ingredients. Today, promising research shows that mushrooms may offer some serious health benefits.

What are medicinal mushrooms, and what are some of their health benefits?

Medicinal mushrooms are fungi that have therapeutic value for humans. They can be eaten as food, brewed for tea, or stepped into tinctures. Mushrooms act as nootropics, compounds that enhance cognitive function. Caffeine, nic-

otine, and ginkgo biloba also are nootropics. The varieties of fungi that are most commonly used for medical purposes include shiitake, maitake, Chaga, lion’s mane, and reishi. They are excellent dietary sources of Vitamin D, fiber, B vitamins (such as folate), and antioxidants. But there’s much more.

Let’s examine five health benefits of medicinal mushrooms.

Brain health

The high level of antioxidants in medical mushrooms, such as lion’s mane, may help stimulate nerve growth in the brain, allowing for improved cognition and memory. Research is ongoing to determine what these findings may mean for the treatment of Alzheimer’s disease and other age-related illnesses.

Immune system support

Some studies indicate that medicinal mushrooms improve the immune system’s ability to fight infection and inflammation. Consumption of the Chaga mushroom, for example, may help regulate the body’s production of cytokines, the compounds that help the body resist infection and disease.

Cancer protection

Medicinal mushrooms, such as shiitake and reishi, produce polysaccharides that stimulate the body’s production of macrophages, T-cells, and natural killer (NK) cells that help prevent cancer or slow down the growth of cancerous cells.

Lower risk of heart disease

Current research indicates that the antioxidants in medicinal mushrooms, such as the shiitake, help lower “bad” cholesterol and blood pressure and boost overall cardiovascular health.

Anxiety and depression reduction

Medicinal mushrooms also may help reduce mental stress. Scientists are having success in treating patients with clinical depression, PTSD, and addictions with medicinal mushrooms.

Although the research is promising, not all mushrooms are right for all patients, and some mushrooms are unsafe. Here are a few precautions.

- Do not eat foraged mushrooms unless they are properly identified.
- Purchase medicinal mushrooms only from a reliable source.
- Take only the recommended dose.
- Talk with your medical professional before taking medicinal mushrooms.

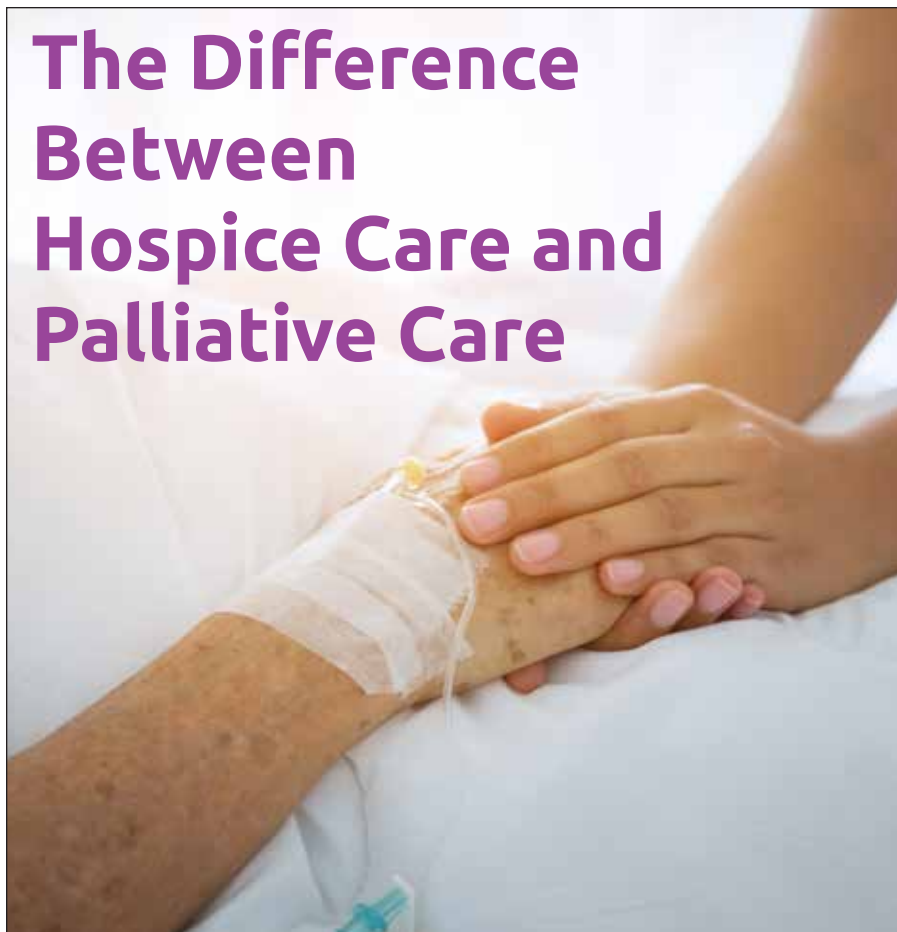
