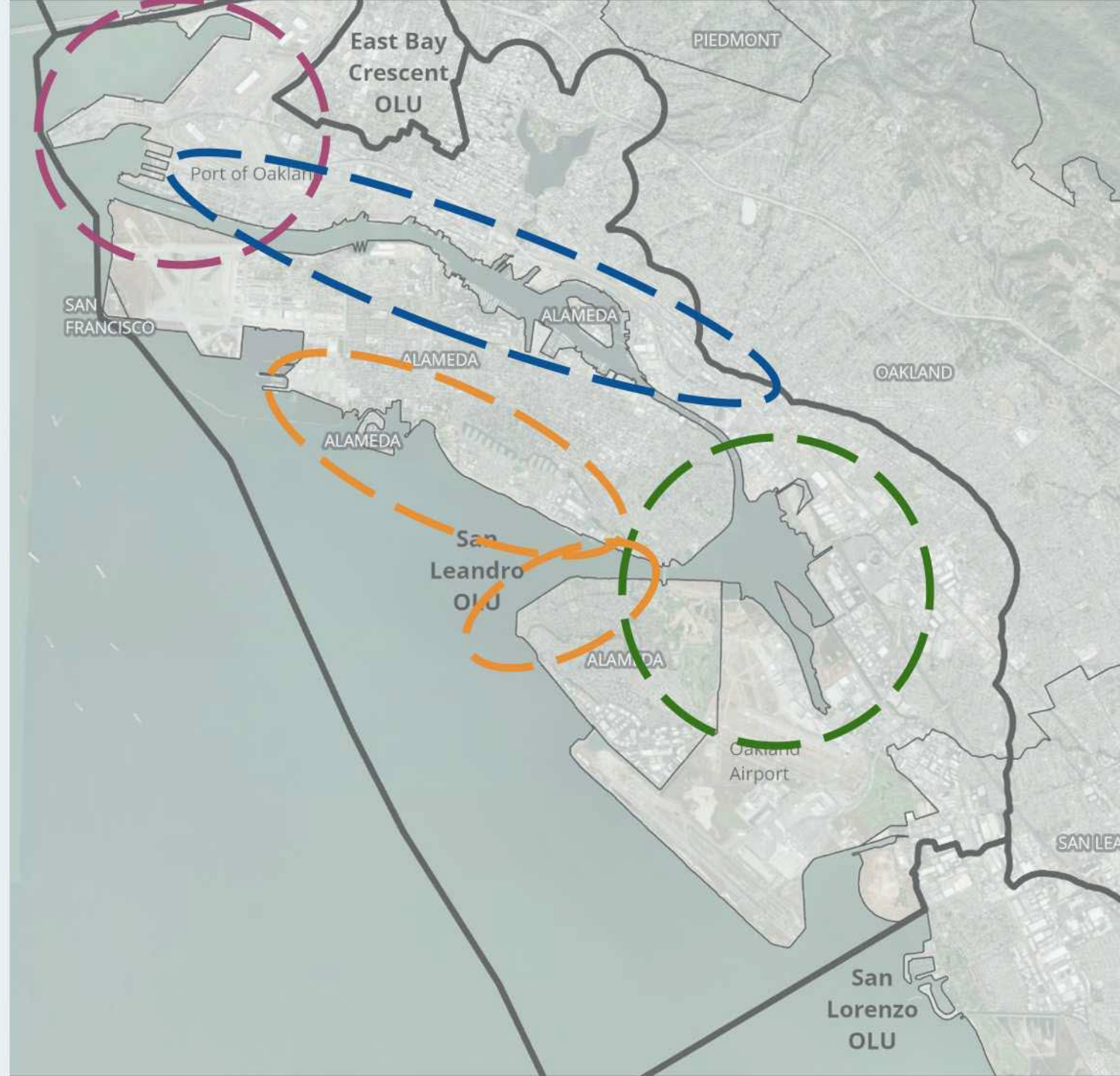

# 4 Focus Areas

- Port - vertical walls, dredged channels, beaches, little marsh/transition zone
- Oakland Estuary and Lake Merritt - narrow, highly modified urban estuary
- San Leandro Bay - marsh habitat, little transition zone, creek mouths, watersheds
- Alameda Beaches - wave-dominated bayfront shoreline
