Rosemary quickly realized the need to increase program revenues to be able to serve more clients, especially those who couldn't afford the cost of their meals. Applying the principles of political fundraising she had learned in her previous career, Rosemary started a newsletter, launched a fundraising-by-mail campaign, and organized annual yard party fundraisers which eventually morphed into the well-attended annual Community Faire & Wine Tasting event; and

for the past 30 years, as a result of Rosemary's hard work, dedication and compassion, AMOW has enhanced the lives of thousands of our Alameda neighbors, by allowing them to age in place, or recover from illness or injury in their own homes, by delivering regular, nutritious meals; and

Rosemary's exemplary interpersonal skills have helped AMOW thrive, as demonstrated by her ability to recruit and motivate more than 150 exceptional and dedicated volunteers; and

in 2004, Rosemary added the "Friendly Visitors" program to AMOW to address the isolation many AMOW clients were experiencing. "Friendly Visitors" matches a volunteer with a recipient for weekly visits, further enhancing many lives; and

Rosemary has always looked for ways that Alameda Meals on Wheels could better serve the needs of the Alameda community. From compassionately communicating with clients and their families, interacting with local police, fire and Adult Protective Services, as needed, seeking fundraising opportunities, and interacting with volunteers, she has grown AMOW into a vital community resource; and

Rosemary Reilly is truly a community treasure. After serving as Executive Director of Alameda Meals on Wheels for the past 30 years, Rosemary is retiring. We thank her profusely for her service to our community and wish her all the best in her well-deserved retirement.
