- Whereas**, Women in Construction Week, celebrated the week of March 3, 2024, highlights women as a viable component of the construction industry and raises awareness about the opportunities available for women in the construction industry and the growing role of women in the industry; and
- Whereas**, the National Association of Women in Construction (NAWIC) is a nonprofit organization first organized in 1955 to strengthen and amplify the success of women in the construction industry, offering education, networking, leadership training, and professional development; and
- Whereas**, in April 1959, Irene Moats and Marie McDonald founded Chapter 19, the San Francisco Chapter of NAWIC. Today, the San Francisco Chapter encompasses the East Bay, including the City of Alameda, San Francisco, South San Francisco, and Northern California; and
- Whereas**, while construction is one of the most male-dominated industries, NAWIC Chapter 19 has seen many of its members develop wonderful careers within the construction industry, going on to become successful officers of companies, business owners, gained professional degrees, and have taken on other leadership roles in industry and their communities; and
- Whereas**, The NAWIC continues to enrich the lives of local women by providing the necessary support structure and equipping them with the right tools to flourish in their careers; and
- Whereas**, the City of Alameda's Public Works Department continues to hire women into various positions involved with construction and encourages ongoing education and networking with the NACIC.
