5. Climate Adaptation Planning for Oakland's Frontline Communities (CAPOFC) Project update (Port of Oakland – Cory Mann and Lynne Madera)

Caltrans is looking into potentially applying for a BUILD grant for the Doolittle Drive area.

Arthur Feinstein: Asked about San Leandro Bay and State Route 61/Doolittle Drive and the interactions with Caltrans. Response: The Doolittle area is a high-priority area for the Port.

Arthur Feinstein: Mentioned the community engagement process, which is being formed according to Lynne. Response: Cory Mann stated that CAPOFC will cover community engagement and will include developing an initial stakeholder list. The study area is the entirety of the Oakland shoreline including the Doolittle area, which is an early priority area. Joan Zatopek added that focus group meetings for specific geographic areas could occur. Lynne Madera said that – at a minimum – the Port staff would provide quarterly updates at the OAAC meetings.
