50th ANNUAL ELKS HOOP SHOOT COMPETITION

October to December, Free! Friday, Dec 12, 2025

A national event, this contest is sponsored locally by the Alameda Elks Lodge 1015 and conducted by the Alameda Recreation and Park Department. Over three million youth from throughout the country enter the competition yearly.

This free competition is held at Alameda Parks and Alameda Point Gym during program hours. The event is open to boys and girls 8 to 13 years-old who attend a school or reside in the city of Alameda.

The contest consists of shooting free throws. Each contestant has 25 shots at the hoop. A child may compete as many times as he or she wishes. Classifications are as follows:

Class A: 12 to 13 year-olds

This division is open to youth who do not reach their 14th birthday before April 1, 2026.

Class B: 10 to 11 year-olds

This division is open to youth who do not reach their 12th birthday before April 1, 2026.

Class C: 8 to 9 year-olds

This division is open to youth who do not reach their 10th birthday before April 1, 2026. (Seven year olds who turn 8 prior to April 1, 2026 will be eligible in this category.)

The winners in each division will go on to represent the City of Alameda and the Alameda Elks at the District Shoot-Off in mid-January, 2026.

PROJECT UPDATES

Enhancing Our Parks & Public Spaces

Our parks and community spaces are getting some fantastic updates! Here's a look at what's been completed and what's coming soon:

Completed Projects

- **Bay Farm Island Library** - A beautiful native garden now surrounds the library, enhancing sustainability and supporting local ecosystems.
- **Linear Park** - 50 new trees have been planted along the walking path, providing shade and a more enjoyable walking experience.
- **Leydecker Softball Field** - Field lights have been converted to energy-efficient LEDs, improving visibility while saving energy.
- **Leydecker Community Center** - Landscaping upgrades are complete, including drought-tolerant plants, shrubs, and new trees around the facility.
- **Estuary Park** - Two new scoreboards have been installed, generously donated by the Friends of the Parks Foundation.



Upcoming Projects

- **Leydecker Park Playground** - A survey on the final design is coming soon. Tentative installation is scheduled for mid-2026.
- **Littlejohn Park** - Basketball court renovation to improve play and safety.
- **Skatepark Improvements** - Enhancements are planned to improve safety, functionality, and fun for skaters of all ages and skill levels.
- **Estuary Park Phase 2** - Expected to go out to bid in July.

We're committed to creating vibrant, accessible, and sustainable community spaces for everyone. Keep an eye out for construction updates and opening announcements!

ALL AGES - ALAMEDA WALKS

ALAMEDA WALKS

2025 Schedule (July to October)

All walks begin at 9 a.m. and last approximately one hour. Where walks are longer, it will be noted and new walks are indicated. Look for the red Alameda Walks hats! While we love the furry pets, we prefer that they wait for you at home.

July 19 - Alameda Hospital, Leonardville (old South Shore), Meyers House Walk

Meet at new Alameda Hospital front entrance inside parking lot, 2070 Clinton Ave. This walk will begin with a discussion of Alameda Hospital from Louise Nakada, public affairs and community engagement spoke person. The group will explore Old South Shore and local famous architects of Alameda.

July 26 - Harbor Bay Isle Walk

Meet at Leydecker Park, 3221 Mecartney Road This walk will explore how all the property across Mecartney Road from Bay Farm was once marshland. We'll see how Utah Construction stepped in to convert the marsh to "made land," and how Ron Cowan and Company stepped in to create what we see today. Stroll with us along the lagoon and enjoy a neighborhood distinctly different from original Bay Farm Island. Dennis Evanosky will lead this walk. Note: Walk lasts 1 hour 15 minutes

August 2 - Crown Beach from West to East Walk

Meet at Doug Siden Visitor Center, 1252 McKay Avenue at Crab Cove near the front steps, on park side of building. This nature walk will take place on paved pathway and will explore the along shoreline, from the Doug Siden Visitor Center to Elsie Roemer Bird Sanctuary. The group will learn about the natural and cultural history of this area. The walk is about 4 miles round trip. This walk will be led by East Bay Regional District Naturalist, Susan Ramos. Walk lasts 2 hour and 15 minutes.

August 23 - Alameda Belt Line and the Alaska Packers

Meet at Marina Cove Waterfront Park at 1575 Clement Avenue (at Stanton Street). This walk will explore and learn about the Alaska Packers use of the property along the waterfront here to "winter" its fleet of "Star" ships. The city later built a railroad nearby to accommodate Calpak's Del Monte warehouse. The railroad yards stood on today's Jean Sweeney Park. Did you know this area was one home to Sunset Field, an early 20th-century airport? Dennis Evanosky will lead this walk. Note: walk lasts 1 hour 15 minutes

September 20 - Krusi Park & Help Shape the Future of Alameda's Shoreline Walk

Meet at Krusi Park, 3001 Otis Drive, at the High Street entrance. This walk will explore the history of Krusi Park, Towata Park and the rising sea levels from the mainland along the shoreline from Towata Park to Elsie Roemer Bird Sanctuary. LEARN bout how local coalitions are planning to address flooding and how to contribute toward the solutions. Note This walk is led by Lauren Eisele, Community Action for a Sustainable Alameda (CASA).

September 27 - Alameda Park Homestead

Meet at Chochenyo Park, 2430 Encinal Avenue (at Park Avenue). The walk will explore one of the oldest parks in Alameda as well as Alfred A.

Cohen who built a railroad and resort with a hotel in this neighborhood. He then created a park exclusively for all his wealthy friends who would buy property and build homes here. None did, except for his uncle William. The park withered on the vine and the hotel became an insane asylum. We'll see how Cohen's dream developed into the neighborhood we know today. Dennis Evanosky will lead this walk. Note: walk will last 1 hour and 15 minutes

October 18 - Neptune Beach Walk

Meet at Doug Siden Visitor Center, 1252 Mc Kay Avenue in the grass area. This walk will explore the site and history of Neptune Beach. The group will start the walk on a street that was once the footprint of a pair of roller coasters. Then see where revelers once swam, danced, and enjoyed all the rides and attractions. The group will also learn how Neptune Beach – which lasted from 1917 to 1939 – was just one of the many beaches and baths that began their lives in 1878 and lasted until 1961. Dennis Evanosky will lead this walk. Note: walk will last 1 hour and 15 minutes

October 25 - North Shore: Two Perspectives & Jingle Town Walk

Meet on the plaza in front of Nob Hill Foods, Bridgeside Shopping Center closest to the waterfront. This walk will explore the northern waterfront of Alameda, point out the many art studios in Alameda and Jingle Town in Oakland. In addition, checking out Cal Rowing House and Oakland Museum's white elephant warehouse. Note: Walk lasts 1 hour 15 minutes & will cross over the Park Street Bridge.

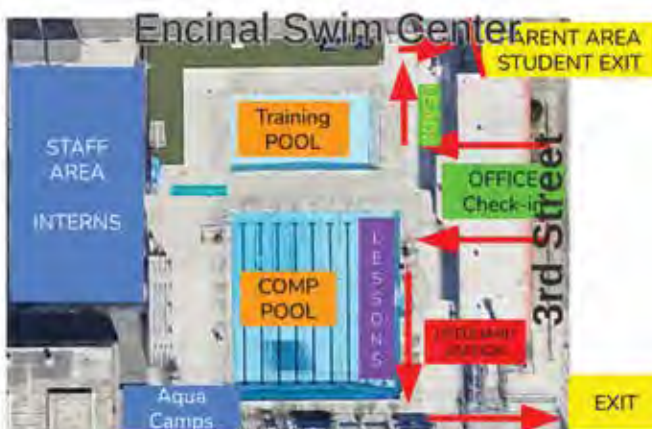

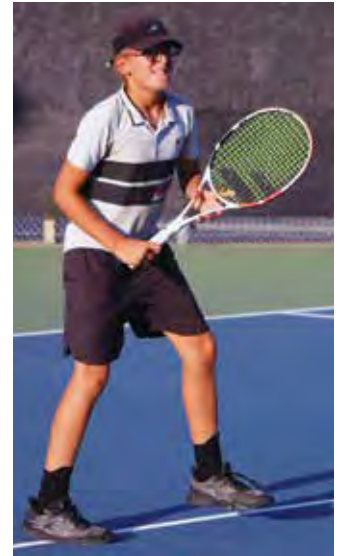
