# TREE REMOVAL NOTICE

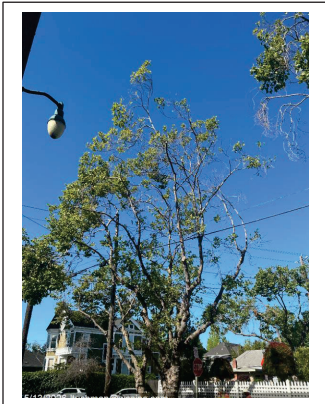

The Public Works Department has scheduled the removal of this publicly owned tree after July 2, 2026.

This tree is being removed for the following reason:

An Arborist evaluation concludes the tree is in decline and additional work around the roots will eventually cause the tree to die, presenting risk. The tree should be removed consistent with the City of Alameda Tree Removal Policy Section D (All Other Tree Removal – 3 Week Notice).

Any resident or property owner can protest this determination in writing: June 11, 2026 – July 2, 2026. Protest procedures are in Section E of the City's [Tree Removal Policy](#).

Summary:

The tree at 1309 Morton St. is causing a public infrastructure and ADA conflict. The tree is also in declining health and will eventually die. There are no practical or reasonable options to mitigate these conditions. Modifications to the surrounding infrastructure would damage the root system of the tree and progress the decline. Removal of the tree will restore the adjacent curb, gutter and street to meet City standards and ADA requirements
