HOW TO DISPOSE OF HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE



Leftover household products that contain corrosive, toxic, ignitable, or reactive ingredients are classified as "household hazardous waste" or "HHW." These products require special care when you dispose of them. Hazardous wastes, like those listed below, do NOT belong in the landfill or in your curbside carts.

Must bring valid ID showing current Alameda County address. Do not mix different wastes in the same container. No individual container may be greater than 5 gal. or 50 lbs. State law limits the total amount you transport in one vehicle to 125 lbs. or 15 gal. Must be transported by a resident of the household which generated the waste.
