
What are "reaches"?

A reach is a segment of shoreline defined to support adaptation planning.

### Primary considerations

- Shoreline conditions
- Watersheds
- Adjacent land uses and jurisdiction boundaries
- Concurrent projects and planning efforts



7 separate planning efforts (black lines)

5 with pre-existing plans (grey lines)

21 remaining (multi-colored lines)

**=** 33 total



Process to co-create draft longterm alternative(s) per reach

- 3 Steering Committee workshops
- Reach-by-reach discussions
- High-level long-term concepts (2100+)
- Focus primarily on coastal flood risk (as opposed to inland) in these workshops
- Iterative process



### **Overall Subregional Process**

- Review existing conditions
- Develop planning principles
  - Co-create long-term alternatives per reach
- High-level feasibility assessment
- Prioritization Framework
- Implementation Approach
